

Sámi University College: a centre of Sámi knowledge and academic competence

Sámi University College (SUC) is a Sámilanguage academic institution that was founded in 1989 with the aim of meeting the need for education among the Sámi people. The Nordic Sámi Institute, established in 1973 as a result of Sámi cultural-political endeavours in the Nordic countries, merged with Sámi University College in 2005. The development of Sámi University College originates from Sámi society's need for its own research and higher education institution.

SUC is an indigenous institution that cooperates with both Sámi and other societies. The reciprocal influence with society is the main characteristic of SUC as an indigenous institution. This reciprocal impact implies a relationship between the University College and society, where the two sides mutually contribute to one an-

other.

Sámi University College has a pan-Sámi and indigenous perspective in its courses of study, research and communication. Whenever planning and prioritising its activities, the College primarily considers the benefits for the progress of Sámi society in the modern age but based on its cultural heritage and at the same level as the majority society.

Sámi University College has since its inception consciously worked to attain the level of a specialised academic institution (in Sámi dieđalaš allaskuvla, in Norwegian vitenskapelig høgskole). In 2012 Sámi University College offers two master's degree programmes, three bachelor's degree programmes and three professional study programmes. Among the courses of study are Sámi language, Duodji (tradi-

tional handicraft), Sámi teacher education, reindeer husbandry and journalism. Sámi culture and traditional information and knowledge also form part of the studies at SUC. During the strategic plan period SUC seeks to strengthen these established programmes, but also intends to introduce new courses of study, in particular new master's degree courses and studies at PhD level: this will ensure a broader recruitment base of students and will support the aim of the University College to become a specialised university institution. The quality of the research and the general progress of SUC will ensure the achievement of this goal.

During the strategic plan period SUC seeks to develop teaching and research

activities all over the Sámi area in a more empowering manner. Sámi University College is a transborder university college. Staff and students come from all four countries where the Sámi reside in addition to other countries. Cross-border cooperation is envisaged by the University College in education, research, administration, information and in the exchange of students and employees.

The Sámi language is at the core of the activities of SUC. The University College is a multilingual institution, although the main language is Northern Sámi. However on a daily basis workers and students also use other Sámi languages and several other major languages. In the strategic plan period SUC also wishes to create are-

nas for learning which do not involve the use of Northern Sámi. In addition, Sámi University College wishes to strengthen the *Lohkanguovddáš* (Centre for Sámi Language in Education), which promotes written and spoken Sámi, and which is a part of the College system from 2012.

SUC received WINHEC (World Indigenous Nations Higher Education Consortium) accreditation in 2008 as an indigenous institution. The University College is an active member of the WINHEC and

UArctic networks and prioritises indigenous cooperation. SUC collaborates actively with other institutions at national and international levels.

The Norwegian Ministry of Education and Research is the main source of funding for the University College. The Nordic Council of Ministers also partly supports research activity at SUC. This is the legacy of the Nordic Sámi Institute upon merging with Sámi University College.





Goals

- To facilitate collaborative agreements with national and international institutions, especially within the Nordic and

- Arctic areas, through appropriate educational offers and research activities
- To secure a firm economic framework to support the achievement of the institution's set goals and strategies
- To secure and promote quality academic staff for research and administration through a consistent employee policy
- · To upgrade staff competence
- To plan efficient use of the institution's resources
- To ensure effective communication with the state authorities and with the Sámi parliaments.

Strategies

Strategies

Sámi University College is to have a firm connection and good communication with Sámi society, as part of the progress in a new era based on the Sámi traditional heritage.

4 A transborder university college

Strategies

- Prioritise SUC's expansion of activities all over the Sámi area
- Cooperate with the other Nordic countries and higher education institutions in the indigenous areas, particularly in connection with WINHEC, in order to promote research and new courses of study
- Promote international cooperation through student and employee exchanges

- Continue the research grant agreement with the Nordic Council of Ministers and actively communicate the research outcomes financed through the Council
- Promote and facilitate indigenous research and education with the help of the latest results of the activities of the University College.

Sámi University College is to enhance its position as the leading higher education and knowledge institution in the Sámi area, and in the indigenous world as a whole.

Monitoring

The implementation of the strategic plan is to be presented annually to the Board, and will be followed up by Board decisions, plans of activities, annual plans, and budget documentations.

This strategic plan was approved on 9.12.2011 and is applicable from 1.1.2012 until 31.12.2016.

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
